

Cutting Chart-12" finished, 12 ½ " unfinished is the first number the second number in the parentheses is for a 8" finished, 8 ½ " unfinished.

Background

A: Cut 4[3 ½" (2 ½")]squares B: Cut 4[3 ½" x 6 ½" (2 ½" x 4 ½")]rectangles to be used with C for quick flying geese.

Fabric #1


C: Cut $8[3 \frac{1}{2}$ " $(2 \frac{1}{2}$ ")] squares to be used with B for quick flying geese.

Fabric #2

D: Cut 1[6 1/2 " (4 1/2 ")] square to be used with Fabric #3 C's for quick corners.

Fabric #3

C: Cut $4[3 \frac{1}{2}$ " $(2 \frac{1}{2}$ ")] squares to be used for quick corners with from Fabric #2...




1992 Augustine Star Medallion

This quilt had a feathered star medallion surrounded by this star block. It is presented here in two sizes a 12" finished, and 8 " finished.


Sewing Directions:

- 1. Use background B rectangles and Fabric #1 C squares to make quick flying geese units. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of you C squares.
- 2. Sew one square on the diagonal line to one end of your rectangle. Trim and press. Sew a second square to the other end of your rectangle. Trim and press. Make 3 more units.
- 3. Draw a diagonal line on wrong side of your Fabric #4 C squares.
- 4. Sew a smaller square on the diagonal line to one corner of your Fabric #2 square. Sew a second square to the opposite corner. Trim and press. Sew the other two smaller squares to the opposite corner. Trim and press.
- 5. Lay out block.
- 6. Assemble rows, then sew rows together.
