

Cutting Chart-10" finished, 10 ½ " unfinished

### Background

B: cut 4[3"] squares. Cut in half once on the diagonal. One extra triangle. These are cut larger and then trimmed down to 2 ½ " after sewing.

C: Cut 2[2 ½ " x 6 ½ "] rectangles

E: Cut 1[4 7/8 "] square. Cut in half once on the diagonal. One extra triangle.

# Fabric #1


B: cut 4[3"] squares. Cut in half once on the diagonal. One extra triangle. These are cut larger and then trimmed down to 2 ½ " after sewing.

A: Cut 1[7"] square. Cut in half once on the diagonal. One extra triangle. These are cut larger and then trimmed down to 6 ½ " after sewing.


D: Cut 1[2 7/8"] square cut in half once on the diagonal

## Fabric #2

A: Cut 1[7"] square. Cut in half once on the diagonal. One extra triangle. These are cut larger and then trimmed down to 6 ½ " after sewing.



Step 4: Sew units to your larger square.



Step 5: Add remaining triangles to the rectangles then sew to your unit from step 4.

# 1998 Plum Baskets

This quilt was made up of this basket block set on point. A large flowered print was used for one of the A triangle. It is presented here in a 10" finished size.

#### **Sewing Directions:**

- 1. Sew a Background B triangle to the Fabric #1 B triangles. Press and trim the square down to  $2\frac{1}{2}$ ". Make 7 units.
- 2. Sew a Fabric #2 A triangle to a Fabric #1 A triangle. Press and trim down to  $6\frac{1}{2}$  ".
- 3. Sew 4 of units from step2 together like the diagram. Sew the remaining 3 units together.
- 4. Sew the unit of 3 squares to the side of unit from step 2. Sew the strip of 4 squares to the top.
- 5. Sew a Fabric #1 D triangle to your Background rectangle. Sew the remaining D triangle to the second background rectangle. Follow the diagram to make sure you get opposite units.
- 6. Sew the rectangle units to each side of your block.
- 7. Add the Background E triangle to the block...



Step 1. Make 7 units; trim down to 2 ½ " after sewing.




Step 2. Make 1 unit. Trim down to 6 ½ " after sewing.



Step 3. Sew 4 squares together. Make sure to follow diagram so your triangles are going in the right directions.

Sew three squares together for the second unit.



Step 6: Add remaining triangle
