

# Cutting Chart-for one quarter of design

Background #4 and #5 Cut 2[2" x 4"] rectangle

*Piece #1*Cut [3" x 5"]rectangle

**Leading** #2 and #3
Cut a strip 1" wide and cut off the lengths you need.


Copy foundation the number of times you want to make the sections.

# 2000 Stained Glass Hummingbird


Hummingbird
This quilt was made up of paper pieced blocks. All the blocks had black fabric for the narrow block lines to act as leading. This foundation finishes at 3". You could use the block separately or make 4 pieces and put together for a 6 "finished block.

You can reduce the size by copying and using a percentage to reduce the size. If you wanted to make it twice as large you would copy it at 200%. Remember the outside seam allowance will also increase in size. When you trim up the foundation just make sure you trim a ½ " beyond the seam line rather than the outside line of the copied foundation.

Make sure that when you print this page you set your scaling option to none in your print window. If you do not do this the templates may not print out to the correct size. You should see a white box besides the words page scaling. Click the down area at the end of this box and choose none.


## Cutting Chart for one quarter of the block Background #4 and #5

Cut 1[3 ½ "] square cut in half once on the diagonal

*Piece* #1-Cut 1[6 " x 2] rectangle

#### Leading-#2 and #3

Cut strip 1" wide. Cut from the strip the length of pieces you need for the leading.
